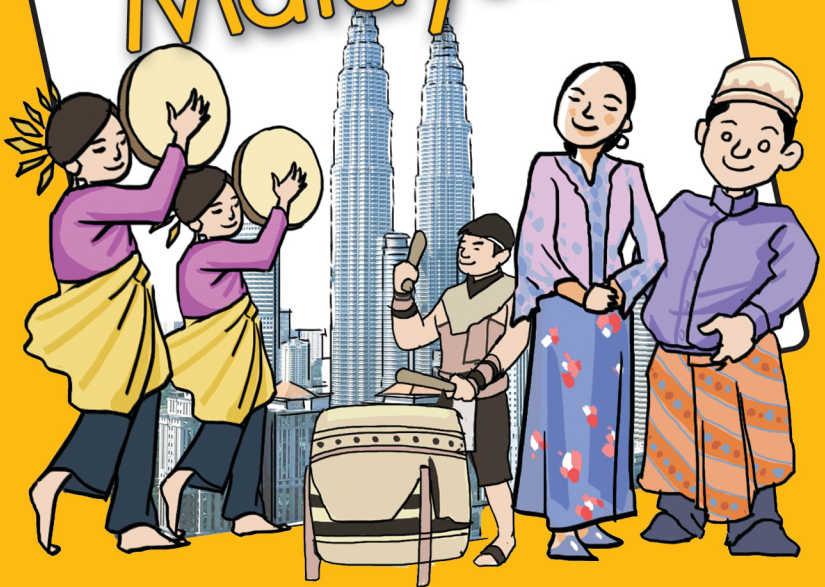

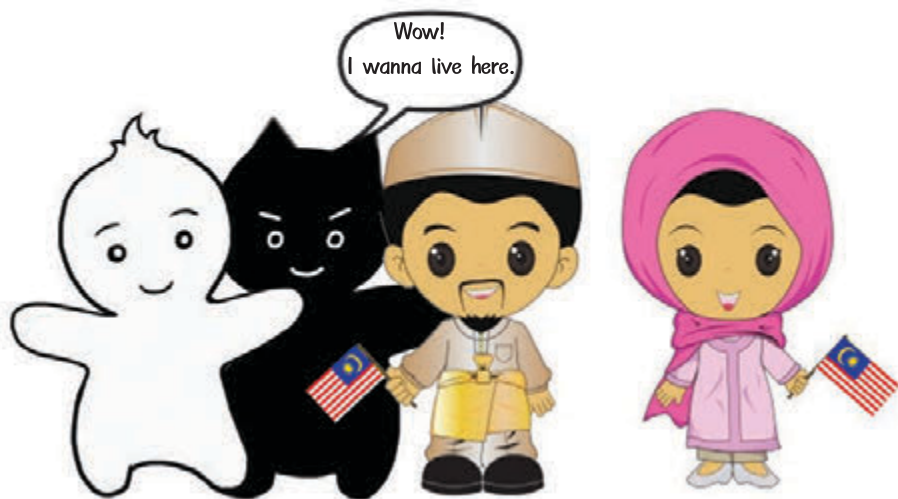




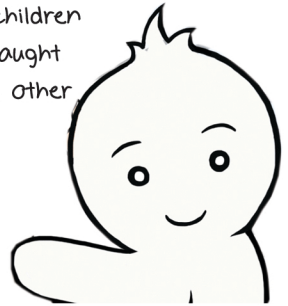
Malaysia consists of two large islands. Malaysia was influenced by Islam, 61.3% of population of Malaysia are Muslim.

Look, Dear, they don't throw the rubbish on the road. What a great town.



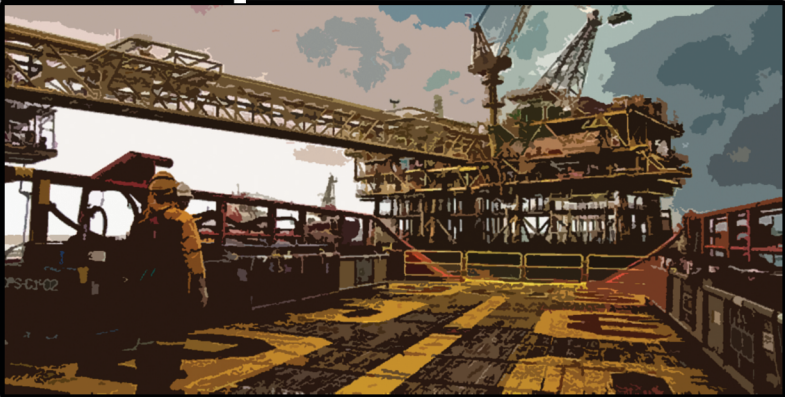


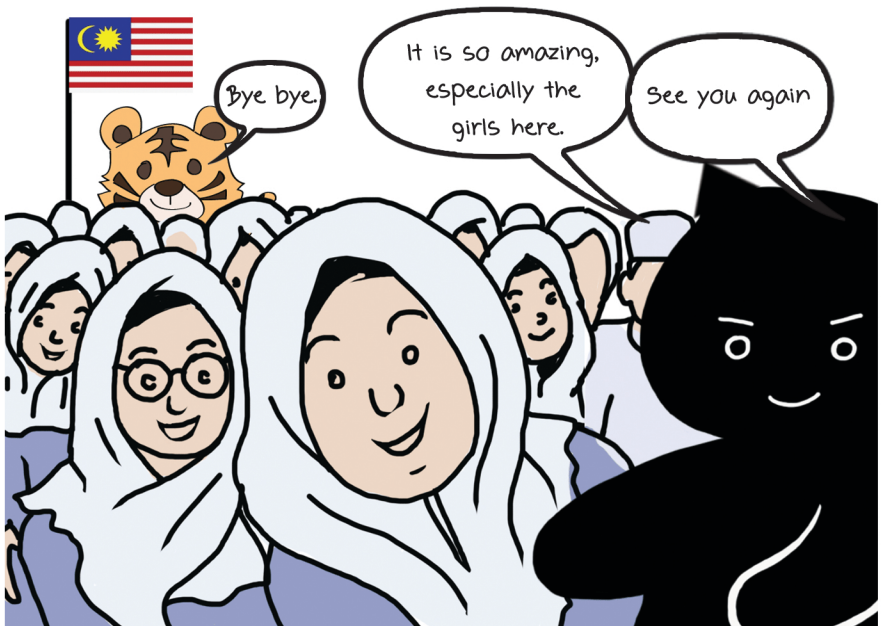
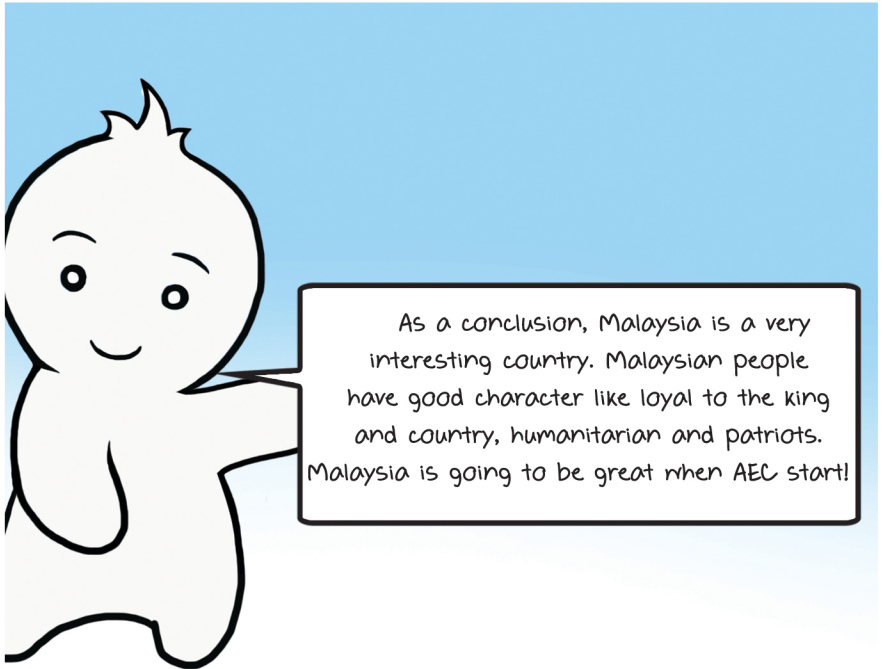
People in Malaysian also realize the importance of family too. They believe that happy family makes happy society so they are willing to use their time with family
