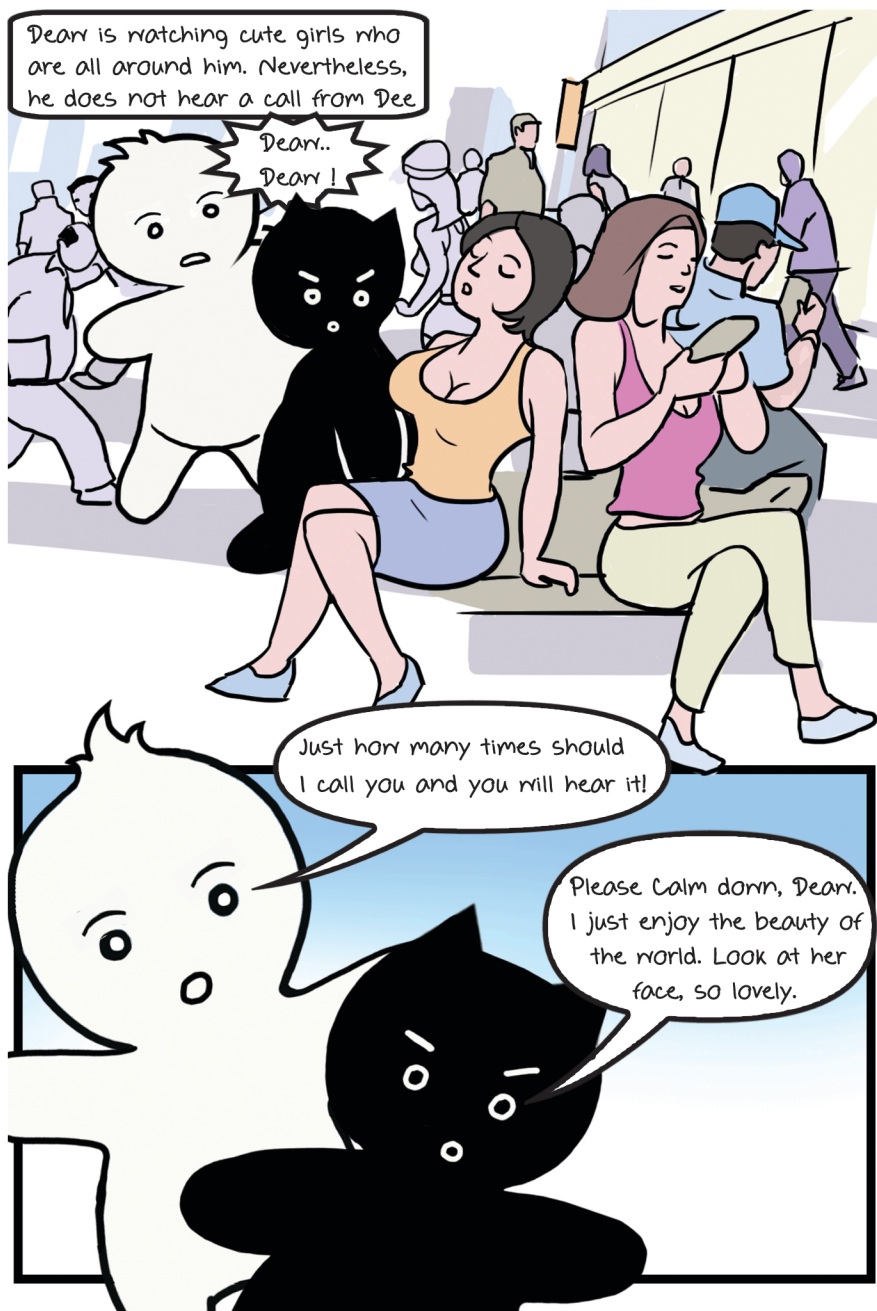


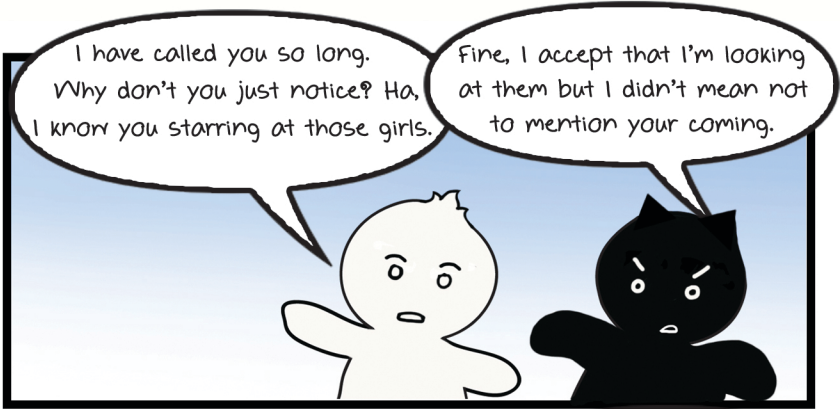

Out there, around our country, are still having men and women who dress themselves nice and polite. Would you love to see?

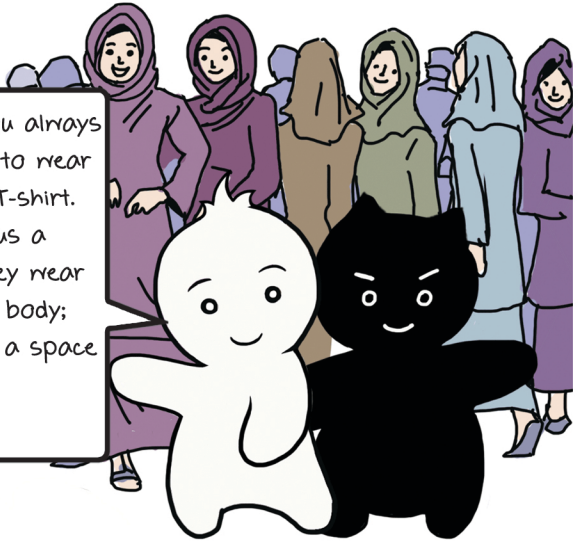
It's Brunei! If you are ready, let's go.

They also help their youths to use the language correctly because their language is unique; it's a symbol of a country. Nevertheless, to have sex before married is forbidden both by law and religious' teaching.

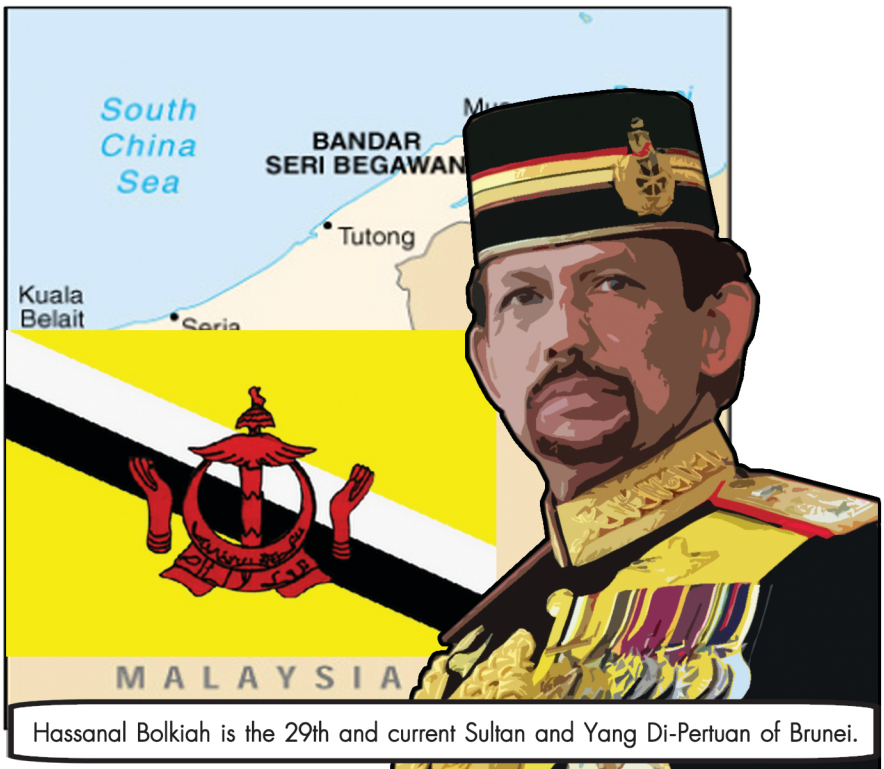




The political system in the country is governed by the constitution and the national tradition of the Malay Islamic Monarchy, the concept of Melayu Islam Beraja (MIB). The three components of MIB cover Malay culture, Islamic religion, and the political framework under the monarchy. It has a legal system based on English common law, although Islamic shariah law supersedes this in some cases.

Until 1979, Brunei's foreign relations were managed by the UK government. After that, they were handled by the Brunei Diplomatic Service. After independence in 1984, this Service was upgraded to ministerial level and is now known as the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Wars in Brunei are not a lot due to how rich the country is. The Spratly Islands dispute is a territorial dispute over the ownership of the Spratly Islands States making claims to various parts of the area include: Brunei, China, Malaysia, the Philippines, Taiwan and Vietnam. All except Brunei occupy some of the maritime features.

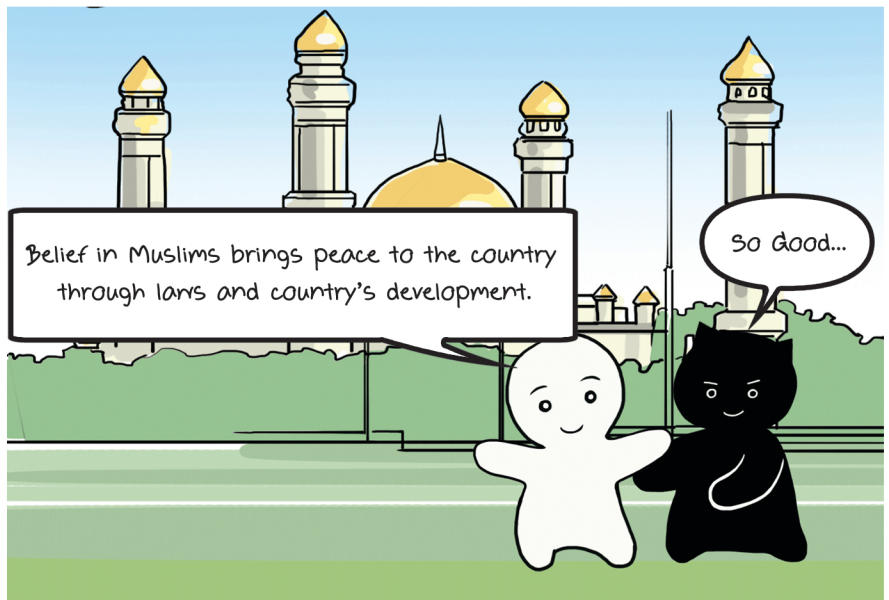
